Cristina Rabadán-Diehl, Ph.D., M.P.H., is the Director of the Office of the Americas in the Office of Global Affairs at the United States Department of Health and Human Services. In this role, she is involved with coordinating U.S. government policy and functions related to HHS international activities in the Americas region.
